




Here's how to customize your fundraising page at Active.com:

- Go to www.active.com/donations and log in with your Active.com credentials (your email address and password).
- Select your 2011 campaign page from the drop-down menu at the upper right (it might be the last one on the list, if you've ridden multiple Tours)
- Select "Customize My Webpage" (just above the drop-down menu)
 - Insert a personalized message. (Suggestion: Create your text in a Word document, then copy/paste it into the text box to avoid the page timing out while you choose your words.)
 - Insert a photo. The file size limit is 100Kb, which is pretty small. If you have a photo that's over the limit, use the tool at <http://pixlr.com/editor/> to crop and/or resize it. It's a simple process. (See attached instructions for resizing photos with pixlr). You can also crop your photo by dragging the cropping tool (top left corner of toolbox) across your photo to define the new image area.
 - Use the "Change Layout" tab to play with the layout of your page (you have to hit "save and finish" before you can see what your new layout looks like, but you can always change it back).
- Finally, if you're a facebook user, click on the facebook icon to post a status message about your ride to your facebook page.

Photo resizing instructions

<p>Go to http://www.pixler.com/editor/</p>	
<p>Click Open Image From Computer</p>	
<p>Select the image from you computer that you want to resize.</p>	<p>The image you use must be a JPG file</p>
<p>At the top of the Pixlr page you'll see a black tool bar. Click Image/Image size...</p>	
<p>A window will pop up showing the current size of the image. Check to be sure the Constrain proportions box is check and then change the image width to 450 pixels. The image Height will change on its own. Click the OK button</p>	
<p>Your image should be smaller now. Next, go back up to the black tool bar at the top of the page and click File/Save...</p>	
<p>You'll see a new popup window showing the resized image. In the lower right corner, the file size of the image is displayed.</p> <p>If the file is less than 100KB then you've don it.</p> <p>Click the Save button in the black toolbar at the top of the page and save the image on your compute.</p> <p>And that's it.</p>
