



2017 STIHL Tour des Trees Myth-Busting

This year's Tour is different. Do you have the facts?

Myth or truth:

It's impossible to ride the Tour AND attend the ISA Conference.

MYTH.

The ISA Conference ends August 2 but the Tour continues through August 5. You can:

- Join us for three days of riding August 3-5.
- Ride on days you don't have conference obligations (even if they're non-consecutive).

This year the Tour is ALL urban riding and trail riding.

MYTH.

The 2017 STIHL Tour des Trees offers a mix of experiences. We'll be on trails and city streets, but some days offer a more rural riding experience:

- Days 1 and 2 include forested countryside along rolling terrain; we will not use bike trails these days.
- Days 5 and 6 include Virginia's scenic wine and equestrian country.
